the excitement about new varieties of plants for the Garden this year, and of course in the glorious expanse of green created by row upon row of fledgling starter plants.



June 12 - The Half Steps For more than 18 years, the Half Steps have been entertaining audiences throughout Minnesota with their unique brand of a cappella music. Gary Zwack, Steve Wilson, Richard Witteman and Paul Fedor bring humor and tight harmonies to an eclectic catalogue of tunes – from Elvis to the Pointer Sisters.

June 26 - Paul Imholte If it has strings, Paul Imholte probably plays it. He sings and plays nearly a dozen string instruments. Along with traditional American and Celtic music, Paul composes both songs and instrumentals. He sings songs of farms, small towns, and life in the Midwest.

Paul's featured instrument is the hammered dulcimer. The hammered dulcimer is a trapezoid shaped instrument that is struck with light hammers and is a forerunner of the modern piano. Along with the hammered dulcimer, he plays fiddle, guitar, mandolin, banjo, autoharp, cello, mountain dulcimer, ukulele, harmonica, and the jaw harp.

In 2021, Paul released *The Lost Forty*, a three-CD set of original songs and instrumentals that presents a retrospect of his career. Making his home in St. Cloud, Minnesota, Paul performs with Ring of Kerry and at festivals and concerts throughout the upper Midwest.


July 10 - Granite City Brass Granite City Brass Quintet is a Central Minnesota based brass quintet. All of the members have strong ties to the St. Cloud area. Many have performed with the St. Cloud Symphony Orchestra as well as other musical organizations such as the Lake Wobegon® Brass Band, Minnesota Centre Chorale Orchestra, Amadeus Chamber Symphony, and Minneapolis jazz and community bands. All have private, school or university teaching experience in music and all have degrees in music or music education.

Steve Hogenson – Trumpet, piccolo trumpet, flugel horn: Steve is a graduate of Concordia College in Moorhead, has 20 plus years of teaching experience in Minnesota, Texas and Idaho, is a lead trumpet player with big bands in the Twin Cities as well as playing in bands, jazz bands and orchestras around Central Minnesota. He has considerable experience with arranging and composition which are significantly featured in performances by Granite City Brass Quintet.

Heidi Martinson – Trumpet and flugel horn: Heidi teaches at Sauk Rapids-Rice Middle School and is a former band director at that same school. Her playing experience includes chamber music, jazz bands, concert bands, orchestras and church musician. She has a Bachelor of Science degree in music education from St. Cloud State University and an Master of Science degree from Southwest Minnesota State University.

Patty Diederichs – Horn: Patty has a Bachelor of Music performance degree from St. Cloud State University and a Master of Music degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She has performed with orchestras in the Madison, Chicago and Washington DC areas. She is principal horn in the St. Cloud Symphony Orchestra, Adjunct Horn Faculty at St. Cloud State University and is an active player with local professional productions and organizations.

John Olson - Trombone: John Olson received his B.S. and M.A. degrees from the University of Minnesota. He taught instrumental music in the Osseo, MN public school system for 36 years and during that time completed additional post-graduate work at Vandercook College in Chicago. He has performed both locally and internationally with both the Lake Wobegon Brass Band and the Mississippi River Brass Band. He actively performs with Victory Park Brass Quintet, Granite City Brass Quintet, Twin Cities Latin Jazz Orchestra, Cedar Avenue Big Band, Century Jazz Ensemble, Jerry O'Hagan Orchestra, Classic Big Band, and St. Croix Jazz Orchestra. John teaches low brass at Anoka Ramsey Community College.

Eric Peterson-Tuba: Eric Peterson, performing is well known in the region as a highly gifted brass instrument maker and repairman. He has attended the University of Minnesota, and is currently active as a freelance tuba player with such groups as the Bloomington Symphony, Sheldon Theater Brass Band, Lake Wobegon® Brass Band and the Ameriikan Poijat brass septet. Eric has acted as the main music editor for American Poijat, and has prepared high quality computer generated editions of the music they like to play.

July 24 - Harper's Chord Harper's Chord is an Americana-country cocktail with a twist of bluegrass. This four-piece musical group, led by vocalist Jill Moore, draws from their love of modern folk, bluegrass, Americana and country music. Harper's Chord has been captivating audiences for over nine years with their sweet harmonies and easy-listening acoustic songs. Their music has been heavily influenced by such artists as Brandi Carlile, Dolly Parton, Sarah Jarosz, Little Big Town, Emmylou Harris and The Duhks.
